

Law No. 5 of 2001 On the Licensing Fees Charged By the Ministry of Public Health 5 / 2001

Articles (1-5)

We, Hamad Bin Khalifa Al-Thani, Emir of the State of Qatar;
Having perused the amended Provisional Constitution, in particular Articles 23, 34 and 51 thereof;
Law No. 11 of 1982 organising medical institutions;
Law No. 2 of 1983 on the practice of the professions of medicine, dentistry and surgery, and amending laws thereto;
Law No. 3 of 1983 organising the pharmaceutical professions and brokers and agents of pharmaceutical factories and companies;
Law No. 8 of 1991 organising the practice of allied medical professions, as amended by Law No. 14 of 1994;
Decree-Law No. 10 of 1993 organising the Ministry of Public Health and assigning the competencies thereof;
Decree No. 35 of 1979 on Hamad Medical Corporation, as amended by Decree No. 38 of 1987;
The proposal of the Minister of Public Health;
The draft law submitted by the Council of Ministers; and
After consulting the opini

Articles

Article 1

Fees for the issuance and renewal of licences stipulated in Laws No. 11 of 1982, 2 of 1983, 3 of 1983 and 8 of 1991, referred to above, and other licences shall be determined in accordance with the table enclosed with this law.

Article 2

- Medical doctors, dentists, pharmacists and technicians working in paramedical or allied medical and nursing professions, and appointed at the Ministry of Public Health, Hamad Medical Corporation, hospitals, health centres, clinics and medical institutions affiliated thereto, shall be exempted from the procedures of licensing for the practice of their profession.
- The Standing Committee on licences at the Ministry of Public Health shall, upon the request of the employer, issue and renew the necessary licences free of charge to the abovementioned professionals throughout the duration of their employment at their appointed place of work.

Article 3

The abovementioned categories of professionals working at the ministries, other government bodies and public authorities and corporations shall be exempted from paying fees for the issuance and renewal of their licence to practice their profession throughout the duration of their employment, provided that each submits the necessary licensing application.

Article 4

Any provision that violates the provisions of this law shall be rescinded.

Article 5

All competent authorities, each within their respective jurisdiction, shall enforce this law from the date of its publication in the *Official Gazette*.
