

Decree-Law No. 9 of 2001: Exempting Private Health Facilities from Customs Duties 9 / 2001

Articles (1-2)

We, Hamad Bin Khalifa Al-Thani, Emir of the State of Qatar,
Having perused the Amended Provisional Constitution, in particular Articles 23, 27, and 34 thereof;
Law No. 2 of 1962, on the regulation of the public fiscal policy in Qatar, as amended by Decree-Law No. 19 of 1996;
Law No. 5 of 1988, promulgating the Customs Law, as amended by Law No. 25 of 1994;
Resolution of the Council of Ministers No. 9 of 1998, on the Permanent Committee for Licensing at the Ministry of Public Health and the assignment of its competences, as amended by Resolution No. 21 of 1999;
The proposal of the Minister of Finance, Economy, and Commerce, and the Minister of Public Health; and
The draft Law submitted by the Council of Ministers;
Hereby promulgate the following:

Articles

Article 1

Private health facilities shall be exempted from customs duties payable on the medical devices, equipment, and furniture imported for them, which are required for the practice of their activity, in accordance with what is determined by the Permanent Committee for Medical Licensing at the Ministry of Public Health; each case individually.

Article 2

All competent authorities, each within its own jurisdiction, shall enforce this Law which shall come into effect from the date of its issuance and shall be published in the *Official Gazette*.
